Small Bear (6½" x 8") Medium Bear (13" x 16½") Large Bear (19" x 24")

Filled with love and ready to comfort, Beauregard gives great hugs. When we originally made the bear 14 years ago, I asked my son if I should give Beauregard a face and he said he already has a face. He was 7...out of the mouths of babes!!! You can make a whole family of bears in sizes small through large for cuddling, home decor, or both!

MATERIALS

For Bear Body:

Fabric (³/₄ yard for large bear, ¹/₂ yard for medium bear, ¹/₄ yard for small bear) - We used vintage chenille, but other possibilities include canvas, faux fur, or quilter's cottons.

Polyester stuffing

Hand needle and thread

For Optional Heart Applique:

Scrap of fabric (6"x6" for large bear, 5"x5" for medium bear, 3"x 3" for small bear) - We used velveteen, but any soft fabric will do.

Fusible Webbing like Heat and Bond Lite or WunderUnder

Tear-away stabilizer

Printing


Print the pages for the desired sized bear pattern. Note: The patterns

are designed to be printed at 100%. Before printing the

patterns, make sure that page scaling is set to none in the

Adobe Acrobat print window. To be sure your pattern printed at the correct size, measure the box on the the first pattern page. It should measure exactly 1 inch by




Pattern Assembly

Cut out each piece at the outermost markings. Overlap the pattern pieces at the shaded areas and pin, glue, tape, or staple them together as shown above.

Use the bear pattern to cut 2 pieces from the main fabric.





Optional applique

Cut a piece of fusible webbing that is a bit larger than the heart. Place the webbing on the pattern, fusible side facing down, and trace the heart on the paper backing (a). Fuse the webbing to the wrong side of the fabric scrap (b). Cut along the traced line

(c). Remove the paper backing

and place the heart fusible side down onto the right side of one of the bear pieces. Use the pattern as a guide to position the heart, then fuse according to the manufacturer's instructions (d).




Optional Applique (continued)

Cut a piece of stabilizer that is about an inch larger than the heart in all directions. Place the stabilizer behind the bear fabric at the position of the heart. Stitch around the perimeter of the heart using a closely spaced, medium-width zig-zag stitch (we used a 3.5 mm stitch width and the second to lowest spacing setting).




Bear Assembly and Stuffing

Place the bear pieces together, right sides facing and align the edges. Pin the layers together, using lots of pins to keep the layers from shifting during stitching (a). Stitch together, '/4" from the aligned edges, leaving an opening (1" for small bear, 2" for medium bear, 3" for large bear) in the leg/foot (b). Snip the seam allowance at the curves (c). Turn right side out (d). Work the edges between your fingers to full roll out the seams. Fold the edges under '/4" at the opening so they are flush with the rest of the allowance and press (e).





Insert small clumps of stuffing into the bear through the opening (**f**). Stuff to the desired firmess, making sure the stuffing is evenly distributed throughout the bear. Pin the layers together at the opening, making sure the folds are in line (**g**). Neatly whipstitch the opening closed (**h**). For a flat, crisp-looking bear, steam press both sides of the finished bear with an iron (**i**)







